

The Gospel recounts the appearance of Jesus to his disciples after his resurrection., Jesus appears to them while they are gathered together, even though the doors are locked out of fear of the Jewish leaders. He greets them with peace, showing his compassion and understanding of their fear and uncertainty. The disciples were afraid, but Jesus' presence brings them peace. The Holy Spirit, which Jesus breathes upon them, is the source of true peace and empowerment. It signifies a new beginning for the disciples, empowering them to carry out the mission of spreading the Gospel and reconciling people to God. At Pentecost, the Holy Spirit descended upon the disciples with great power, empowering them to boldly proclaim the Gospel in different languages. This event marks the birth of the Christian Church and the beginning of its mission to the world. We too are called to be witnesses of Christ's love and forgiveness in the world. The Holy Spirit equips us with the gifts and courage we need to fulfil our purpose and spread the message of salvation to all nations. Many of the gifts of the Spirit in the second reading are about a deep unity among us - trust, love, patience. These and other gifts of the Spirit bring unity at a deep level in families, friendships, all kinds of relationships and communities. Today is a time for us to celebrate who we are and to rediscover what it means to be the people of God. Down through the centuries the Holy Spirit has guided the church. We have the witness of many generous and heroic people who have been 'led by the Spirit'



and whose lives have given eloquent testimony to the power of God at work in them. We take heart and invoke the Spirit of God that we may be filled with a joyful appreciation of who we are and what we have to give. This brings with it many challenges, since for many religious people their faith acts as a sort of security blanket, offering certainty and security. The good news is not about how things were in the past but about the Spirit of God at work now and always. As we celebrate Pentecost, let us open our hearts to the Holy Spirit and allow it to work in and through us for the glory of God.

MONTH OF MARY The month of May is a time when the people of God express with intensity their love and devotion for the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is traditional in this month to pray the Rosary at home within the family. May is dedicated in a special way to honouring and seeking the intercession of Mary as the mother of God and Mother of the Church. The Rosary will be said after the 10.00am Mass Monday-Saturday in the month of May.

PENTECOST This weekend, the Church celebrates Pentecost, one of the most important feast days of the year that concludes the Easter season and celebrates the beginning of the Church. Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word "pentecoste," meaning 50th. Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room. A "strong, driving" wind filled the room where they were gathered, and tongues of fire came to rest on their heads, allowing them to speak in different languages so that they could understand each other. It was such a strange phenomenon that some people thought the Christians were just drunk - but Peter pointed out that it was only the morning, and said the phenomenon was caused by the Holy Spirit.

CONGRATULATIONS to our young Parishioners. This weekend we pray especially for the 17 young Candidates who are being Confirmed by Bishop Paul Hendricks with the gift of the Holy Spirit. We are grateful to the Parents who kept their baptismal promises to lead their children in faith. May the many graces and the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit empower them to become fully like Jesus, so going to the world the give a good witness to his love.


